Zacchaeus

Story Suggestion:

Luke 19:1-10

The story of Zacchaeus shows Jesus' divinity and His humanity. Zacchaeus, being a small man, climbed into a tree to see Jesus, because the crowd around Him was so large. Jesus knew Zacchaeus by name and called him down from the sycamore tree. Jesus told Zacchaeus to come down because He wanted to go to his house that very day! Zacchaeus, who was a greedy tax collector, was so moved by the Lord's love and forgiveness that he said he would return the money he had stolen, and give many of his possessions to the poor.

Game Ideas:

Biggest and Smallest

Directions:

Divide the children into two teams, one being the "Biggest Specialists" and the other being the "Smallest Specialists." Pick out an object such as a book, and tell one team member from the "Biggest" group to find the biggest book in the room, and one team member from the "Smallest" group to find the smallest book in the room. Try having them search for other items like dolls, blocks, crayons, etc. Have the teams switch roles, if there is time.

Directions:

Zacchaeus was a chief tax collector. Have a child come up to you and whisper what he or she wants to be when they grow up. Have them act out what they want to be, and see if the rest of the class can guess what they are. You can help each child with actions, if they need help. Give each child a turn at acting.

Snack Ideas:

Dirt Snack

Ingredients:

2 cups milk 1 package chocolate instant pudding 1 (8 oz). Cool Whip

1 (16 oz.) package Oreo cookies, crushed Clear plastic cups

Art Center Ideas:

Zacchaeus in a Tree

(A helper is recommended for this project.)

Materials:

Brown and blue construction paper Crayons Glue sticks Scissors Pencil

Directions:

Give each child a piece of brown construction paper. Trace the child's forearm and outstretched hand onto the construction paper. Cut it out. This is a tree. Give each child a piece of blue construction. Have them glue their "tree" to the blue construction paper (representing the sky). Let the children draw a man sitting in the tree. This will be Zacchaeus. Write the following verse (or another verse of your choice) on the bottom of each child's drawing: "Today salvation has come to your house." Luke 19:9a
